1. Call to request an application packet. Return your application by mail or in person. Pay the \$95 nonrefundable application fee along with submitting a copy of your high school transcript or GED.
2. Schedule to take the WorkKeys™ Reading test, Interest Inventory, and Manual Dexterity test.
3. Once pre-requisite testing is done and you have been accepted into the program pay the first quarter tuition fee to reserve your seat in class.
