

Tri-Rivers Career Center Fall 2020 End-of-Course Testing Frequently Asked Questions

1. **When are the end-of-course exams?**

The testing window for Tri-Rivers opens December 1st and our hope is to have all tests completed by December 10th. This will be the first Tuesday after Thanksgiving Break.

2. **What will the 2-hour delay schedule be for December 1st-December 10th?**

Tri-Rivers will run on a two-hour delay schedule for these dates. Your student only needs to report during the testing time frame (8:15-10:15) when they are scheduled to take a test. Please see question 4 for more information Please see below for the 2-hour delay schedule:



3. What tests are assigned on what days?

December 9th	A Day	ELA II & Make-Ups
December 10th	B Day	ELA II & Make-Ups

4. We will still run a hybrid schedule during testing?

Yes, Tri-Rivers has already communicated that we will be utilizing a hybrid schedule up to Winter Break. Your child's testing days, if they are assigned any, will correspond with their day of attendance. There are a few instances in which a student will need to report on their remote days for testing. They will only need to stay at Tri-Rivers for the testing time. Please see below for the hybrid schedule for testing:



5. What is the schedule for my student?

Each student will be provided with their own schedule, as the tests are assigned to each student and reviewed by Student Services individually. Students will receive a testing schedule this week if they are in attendance. If they are not in attendance, it will be emailed to their school email. If they misplace their testing schedule handout, they can contact Mrs. Large at klarge@tririvers.com or Mrs. Ross at aross@tririvers.com to obtain another copy. If your student does not receive a hardcopy of their schedule or an email with their schedule, then they are not assigned any tests.

6. What will my student do if they are not scheduled to take a test during the testing window?


Students who are not scheduled to take a test have two options. They can either not attend until the first period on the days they do not test; or they can come to school at their normally scheduled time (8:15) and they will go to their labs until the testing window is over.

7. What should my student do if they are scheduled on a day where they only need to complete testing?

Students who need to come in during their remote days to take a test, will be permitted to leave after they have completed their tests. If they are a driver, they will be permitted to drive home. If they are not a driver, they can be picked up from school or they can stay at school. If they have to stay at school for the entire day, they will be monitored by a staff member and asked to complete remote work (they will not be allowed to go to their classes).

8. How should my student prepare for testing?

Students should get a good night's rest prior to any tests, they should bring a pencil, their fully charged Chromebook and charger, and take advantage of the free breakfast that is offered daily this school year. 9. What if my student rides the bus and must attend school at the normal time, even if they are not scheduled to test?

If your student rides the bus to school, and no alternative transportation is available, the students can still come to school at their normally scheduled time and go to their labs until the testing window is over.

10. What do I do if my student only attends half day or a portion of the day?

If your student only attends part time he/she will need to follow the schedule they would normally follow if Tri Rivers is on a 2 hour delay. The student needs to complete their assignments via Canvas. The student is encouraged to communicate with their teacher during this testing time frame.
