- 1) Tri-Rivers Career Center signed and returned the CARES HEERF Certification and Agreement for Student's Portion on May 8, 2020; and approval for the Grant award was received on May 28, 2020. In this agreement, Tri-Rivers Career Center agreed to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
 - 2) The total amount of funds available to Tri-Rivers Career Center for distribution of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$123,994.
 - 3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) is \$123,994. These funds were disbursed June 18, 2020.
 - 4) There were 99 students at Tri-Rivers Career Center that were deemed eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
 - 5) As of June 18, 2020; a total of 82 students received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
 - 6) The institution determined that active students that were enrolled in a full-time (600 hours or longer) program as of May 28, 2020 and were still in an active enrollment status were deemed eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant for students. Students had to certify that they incurred expenses due to the coronavirus and will utilize the emergency grant relief funds to cover these associated costs. Students were given the option to fill out an application for grant monies, with the minimum of \$400 for low needs and \$800 for higher needs. The deadline for grant applications was June 8, 2020. Once the grant applications were received, the school determined that students who requested low needs would receive \$800.12, and students who requested high needs would receive \$1,539.16, thus disbursing all of the grant money the school was awarded under Section 18004(a)(1).
 - 7) The 82 students that were eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant were required to fill out an application in which they provided information on the financial hardships they faced as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, including food, housing, course materials, technology, healthcare and childcare.
