# LPN to RN Diploma Program

The **LPN to RN Diploma Program** has full approval status with the Ohio Board of Nursing. The program is an intensive nursing curriculum that builds on the student's practical nursing education and work experience, enhancing and bridging the gap from the practical nurse to the new role of the registered nurse.

The "hybrid" program requires students to participate in both the classroom and online. Skills lab and clinical experiences allow students to apply evidence-based practice. The program culminates in the final quarter with a preceptorship allowing students the opportunity to practice in the real world nursing environment.

The program is offered in 2 formats:

- ◆ 45-weeks
  - Classroom: Wednesday & Thursday (8am-4pm)
  - Clinical: Monday (12-hrs.)
- ◆ 90-weeks (August to June, 2 years)
  - Classroom: Tuesday (8am-4pm)
  - Clinical every other Saturday (12-hrs.)

The program is divided into 4 quarters:

- ◆ Quarter I: LPN to RN Transition Course
- ◆ Quarter II: Clinical Nursing I & Mental Health Nursing
- ◆ Quarter III: Clinical Nursing II & Community Health Nursing
- ◆ Quarter IV: Clinical Nursing III & Professional Transitions

Students who successfully complete the program may apply for Registered Nursing licensure examination ([www.ncsbn.com](http://www.ncsbn.com)). Our current first-time pass rates are:

- ◆ 2018 = 100%
- ◆ 2019 = 92.8%

### **APPLICATION INFORMATION**

Program applicants must submit or complete the following:

-Submit a completed application form and application fee.

-Hold a current, valid licensure to practice as a Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse in at least one U.S. state or territory and the ability to obtain endorsement by the Ohio Board of Nursing.

-Hold a current certificate to perform limited intravenous therapy.

-Successful completion of the ATI LPN Comprehensive test (at or above the current mean national score).

-Complete WorkKeys® testing with a score of 5 or greater for each of the 3 tests.

-Submit a typed, 1-2 page formal letter requesting admission to the program.

-Complete all pre-requisite courses by August 1st with a C or better (see next section).

-Submit official transcripts from all high schools, GED, and post-secondary institutions.

Application deadline is March 1st for August admission.
