Quarter Ending: 12/31/2021

- 1) Tri-Rivers Career Center did not receive any additional CARES Act HEERF Student Funds during this quarter.
- 2) The total amount of funds available to Tri-Rivers Career Center for distribution of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$412,738.
- 3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) for this quarter was \$214,252. Of the funds distributed \$51,952 were from HEERF II funding and \$162,400 were from HEERF III funding. These funds were disbursed in October 2021.
- 4) There were 69 students at Tri-Rivers Career Center that were deemed eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act for HEERF II funding. There were 150 students at Tri-Rivers Career Center that were deemed eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act for HEERF III funding.
- 5) For this quarter reporting period 10/01/21 - 12/31/21; a total of 148 students received an Emergency Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 6) The institution determined that eligible students for HEERF II funds were those that met the following criteria: an active student, enrolled in a 600-hour or longer program as of May 1, 2021 who had completed the 2020-2021 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The awards were prioritized by students with *exceptional need*. The school used the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) to identify students with *exceptional need*. Grant fund awards were calculated based on a sliding scale correlated to a student's EFC. The EFC range was \$0 - \$5,711 and the awards ranged from \$1,000 to \$600. The school also identified ten students with an exceptional need due specifically to the coronavirus preventing normal student council activities for the school year and awarded student specific grants to meet a normal cost of attendance expense for this specific cohort. These grants ranged from \$210 to \$678.

The institution determined that eligible students for HEERF III funds were all students enrolled in any of our accredited programs. The awards were prioritized by students with *exceptional need*. The institution used the program's overall cost of attendance to prioritize and determine award amounts. Students had to certify that they had a financial need for assistance with cost of attendance items or emergency costs related to the coronavirus. The awards ranged from \$500 to \$1,200.



- 7) The 150 students that were eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant were provided a form with an allocation of grant funds that they could request. By returning a signed form they agreed that the funds were to be used for emergency costs due to the coronavirus pandemic that were part of their overall Cost of Attendance. They were given the option to accept and have the grant issued directly to them, to credit their student account with the HEERF grant funds to cover eligible expenses or to acknowledge that they do not need any grant funds at this time and to decline the grant.
