



Student Portion - CARES Act  
Quarter Ending: 03/31/22

- 1) Tri-Rivers Career Center did not receive any additional CARES Act HEERF Student Funds during this quarter.
- 2) The total amount of funds available to Tri-Rivers Career Center for distribution of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$198,486.
- 3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) for this quarter was \$198,486. All the funds distributed from HEERF III funding. These funds were disbursed in March 2022.
- 4) There were 120 students at Tri-Rivers Career Center that were deemed eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act for HEERF III funding.
- 5) For this quarter reporting period 01/01/22 - 03/31/22; a total of 120 students received an Emergency Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 6) The institution determined that eligible students for HEERF III funds were all students enrolled in any of our accredited programs. The awards were prioritized by students with *exceptional need*. The institution used a student's Pell Grant eligibility and/or Expected Family Contribution (where applicable) to help prioritize awards along with the program's overall cost of attendance to determine award amounts. Students were asked to certify that the funds awarded would be used to meet a financial need emergency cost for an expense that fell within the overall Cost of Attendance categories of the program they were in. The awards ranged from \$500 to \$2,500.
- 7) The 120 students that were eligible to receive the Emergency Financial Aid Grant were provided a form with an allocation of grant funds that they could request. By returning a signed form they agreed that the funds were to be used for emergency costs due to the coronavirus pandemic that were part of their overall Cost of Attendance. They were given the option to accept and have the grant issued directly to them, to credit their student account with the HEERF grant funds to cover eligible expenses or to acknowledge that they do not need any grant funds at this time and to decline the grant.
