Tri-Rivers Career Center provides excellent financial stewardship

Tri-Rivers Career Center (TRCC) has a strong track record of maximizing resources and streamlining costs. The administration and Board of Education work hard to maintain a balanced budget while providing for the needs of students in our District. TRCC obtains grants and uses those funds in ways beneficial to secondary and adult students while saving taxpayers money.

Our Board of Education approved the Spring Five Year Forecast at their regular May meeting. Tri Rivers Career Center is in a strong financial position for the next five years based on current assumptions in the forecast. Spending from cash reserves (savings account) will occur in the next few years based on plans to provide necessary upgrades to our facilities including completion of renovations and equipment upgrades to the Cafeteria and the Culinary Arts Lab and a new Heavy Equipment Operations Training facility. There is also a plan to upgrade several of the industrial labs with new state-of-the-art training equipment necessary for students to learn skills required to obtain industry recognized credentials and gain employment. The district is hoping to receive assistance with these equipment purchases from ODE (Ohio Department of Education) through funds recently approved in the new biennium budget.

Expenditures over the past year include the purchase of a bulldozer, excavator, and front loader for training in the Construction Trades Academy. RAMTEC is partnering with The Ohio State University Marion campus to purchase robotics equipment with the use of grant funds from the Innovative Workforce Investment Program, general fund dollars, and funds made available to OSUM from the Marion Community Foundation. We have purchased SMART manufacturing training cells for use in the Diesel & Power Equipment Technology program as well as tooling and

trainers for Snap On certifications. New kennels were purchased for use in Veterinary Science as they care for cats from the local humane society. A new CNC press brake, crane, and material handler were purchased for use in the Welding Fabrication Lab so students are trained and certified on equipment they will use in the workplace.

We used some of our Innovative Workforce Investment Program grant money to update equipment and share used equipment and resources with North Union to help them assist students in gaining industry recognized credentials and obtain a pathway to graduation.

TRCC will continue to operate in a frugal manner with open and transparent financial decisions always striving to see a positive return on educational investments.

Cafeteria News

The Tri-Rivers Cafeteria will once again offer free breakfast to all students for the 23-24 school year. Last year our cafeteria employees served a nutritious and delicious breakfast to approximately 230 students who may not have typically eaten breakfast otherwise.

The staff offers a variety of hot and cold breakfast items compliant with USDA, ODE, and federal guidelines. We encourage all TRCC students to participate each morning! Breakfast is served each school day from 7:45-8:15 a.m in the cafeteria.

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Tri-Rivers earns 4.5 Star Rating on the Report Card

The preliminary Report Card data for the 2022-2023 School Year was recently released.

This year the state has changed the Alpha letter grade rating to a 5-star rating scale. As you can see, based on our data, we have earned a 4.5 Star rating on a 5-star scale.

We continue to show great strides in Technical Skill Attainment from 78.8% last year to 82.8% this year in our Career Technical Planning District (CTPD) with 93.4% proficient or above in our JVSD. Again, Technical Skill Attainment is our State WebXams for our CTE courses that are offered in our school.

We are very excited to see that 90.6% of our students have gained some type of industry credentials with 54.7% of them gaining a 12pt industry recognized credential. These types of gains are not only good for our students but also good for our community and our economy.

Lastly, I would like to emphasize that our students have a 93.5% Post Program Placement from Tri-Rivers—this is thanks to our wonderful instructors that have put in the time and effort to make sure our students are engaged with what they need to succeed once they leave our JVSD.

I have added the JVSD data for comparative purposes so that you can see the work that is being done at TRCC specifically.

We are excited to see this data continue to grow in the right direction and we are thankful for the opportunity to serve the students of TRCC-JVSD and CTPD.
